(a) Keep current with preventive care guidelines that apply to their patients and ensure that the interventions they recommend are well supported by the best available evidence. (b) Educate patients about relevant modifiable risk factors. (c) Recommend and encourage patients to have appropriate vaccinations and screenings.

Aspirin use to prevent cardiovascular disease and colorectal cancer for adults 50 to 59 years with a high cardiovascular risk. Blood pressure screening. Cholesterol screening for adults of certain ages or at higher risk. Colorectal cancer screening for adults 50 to 75. Depression screening.

Preventive Care You and your family may be eligible for some important preventive services at no additional cost to you. If your plan is subject to the new requirements, you may not have to pay a copayment, co-insurance, or deductible to receive recommended preventive health services, such as screenings, vaccinations, and counseling.

However, many adolescents (i.e., persons 11-21 years of age i.e., as defined by the American Medical Association (AMA) and the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP)) and young adults (i.e., persons 22-39 years of age) continue to be adversely affected by vaccine-preventable diseases (e.g., varicella, hepatitis B, measles, and rubella), partially because vaccination programs have not focused on improving vaccination coverage among adolescents.

Immunization of Adolescents Recommendations of the ...

Developing a preventive care plan for elderly patients with increasing frailty and limited life expectancy can be challenging. We recommend covering the following primary care preventive considerations: cancer, cardiovascular disease, falls and osteoporosis, and preventive immunizations.

Approach to preventive care in the elderly

Aspirin to prevent cardiovascular disease (to age 79, if benefit outweighs the possible harm) Exercise (3 times per week for 30 minutes and strength training 2 times per week) Healthy diet; dietary counseling for those with high cholesterol and other risk factors for diseases related to diet Limit ...
