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### Frege S Theory Of Sense

Friedrich Ludwig Gottlob Frege (b. 1848, d. 1925) was a German mathematician, logician, and philosopher who worked at the University of Jena. Frege essentially reconceived the discipline of logic by constructing a formal system which, in effect, constituted the first 'predicate calculus'. In this formal system, Frege developed an analysis of quantified statements and formalized the notion of a 'proof' in terms that are still accepted today.

### Frege's Theory of Sense and Reference by Wolfgang Carl

Frege introduces a new theoretical notion, sense, which he thinks can resolve at least parts of each of the preceding three objections to the theory of language of the Begriffsschrift: "It is natural, now, to think of there being connected with a sign, ...besides that to which the sign refers, ...what I should like to call the sense of the sign, wherein the mode of presentation is concerned."

### Frege's theory of sense - University of Notre Dame

Frege's theory allows proper names to express senses that fail to present an object.1 For instance, the name 'Pegasus' expresses a sense that might also be expressed by the description 'the winged horse'. This sense does not present an object, and so the name fails to refer.

Because Frege used definite descriptions in many of his examples, he is often taken to have endorsed the descriptivist theory. Thus Russell's theory of descriptions was conflated with Frege's theory of sense, and for most of the twentieth century this "Frege-Russell" view was the orthodox view of proper name semantics.

Frege's 1892 paper, "On Sense and Reference" ("Über Sinn und Bedeutung"), introduced his influential distinction between sense ("Sinn") and reference ("Bedeutung", which has also been translated as "meaning", or "denotation"). While conventional accounts of meaning took expressions to have just one feature (reference), Frege introduced the view that expressions have two different aspects of significance: their sense and their reference.

Frege's notion of Bedeutung is one of the most controversial notions in his philosophy. There is not even any agreement on how to translate the term into English. Different proposals have been made: "nominatum" (Carnap/Feigl), "reference" (Black), "significance" (Tugendhat), or "meaning".
