Another common reading comprehension

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assessment is called a "cloze" task — words are omitted from the passage, and the child is asked to fill in the blanks with appropriate words. Also, young children's reading comprehension can be assessed by asking them to read and follow simple instructions, such as, "Stand up" or, "Go look out the window."

Ask questions.

Students show that they understand a text not just by being able to answer questions about it, but also to generate questions about the text. Asking questions, such as 'who', 'what', 'when', 'where', 'why', and 'how" helps readers get meaning out of a text.

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Word to check the spelling and grammar of text in other languages, and a document contains text in multiple languages, Word displays readability statistics for text in the last language that was checked.

Calculating Reading Level With the

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Reading Level Of **Flesch-Kincaid Scale**

The Content Area Reading Inventory (CARI) is an informal measure of performance on reading materials. In this assessment, the teacher first selects a passage of 250-300 words, usually from the textbook. Next, the students will take 15-20 minutes to read, usually recording their start time, finish time, and total time.

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Strategies to Assess Reading Proficiency for Effective ...

- Flesch Reading Ease Score: Rates text on a 100-point scale; the higher the score, the easier it is to understand the document. For most standard documents, aim for a score of approximately 60 to 70. The formula for the Flesch Reading Ease score is: $206,835 -$

Teachers may elect to have students self-correct. The teacher collects assessment

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results to monitor individual student progress and to inform future instruction. Both student and teacher can quickly assess whether the student acquired the intended knowledge and skills. This is a formative assessment, so a grade is not the intended purpose.
