His father, Gregory, was a bishop, possibly of Osma. (At this time it was acceptable for married men of high standing to join the clergy, leading a celibate life after ordination.) John, Braulio's elder brother, preceded him as bishop of Zaragoza, the most important see in the Ebro valley, from 619 - 631.
