CLASSROOM and ACTIVITY GUIDE

In the sensory table add mud, bits of play dough, twigs, grasses, bits of yarn, thread, small pebbles, etc.. Give each child a pair of tweezers or tongs and explain that birds can only use their beaks (tweezers) and feet (hands) to build their nest.
