INTRODUCTION.

Enteral nutrition is defined as providing nutrients via the gastrointestinal tract. Although the term technically refers to nutrition given either by mouth or through a

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feeding tube, in common usage, the term usually refers to tube feeding and includes feeding via nasogastric tube, gastrostomy tube, gastro-jejunostomy tube, or jejunostomy tube.

Overview of enteral nutrition in infants and children ...

Enteral nutrition avoids the need for central venous access, thus

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diminishing infections and eliminating the thrombotic and hepatic complications of parenteral nutrition. Malnourished children unable to maintain adequate nutrition can benefit from enteral feeding.
