What Was The Final Solution? - History

In the summer of 1941, Heydrich was given responsibility for the "Final Solution of the Jewish Question" and convened the Wannsee Conference in January 1942. Appointed to run the Reich Protectorate of Bohemia and Moravia in September 1941, he brutally suppressed Czech resistance while supervising the deportation of Jews from the Czech lands.

What was the "Final Solution"? - About Holocaust

The details of the "Final Solution" were worked out at the Wannsee Conference. All Jews in Germany and the occupied countries were deported to sealed ghettos as a holding area. Many were then shipped in cattle cars to labor camps where they lived under brutally inhuman conditions.

They understood that "evacuation to the east" was a euphemism for concentration camps and that the "final solution" was to be the systematic murder of Europe's Jews, which is now known as the Holocaust.
