The Lake Wales Ridge, sometimes referred to as the Mid-Florida Ridge, is a sand ridge running for about 150 miles south to north in Central Florida. Pine Ridge holds an important place in Lakota history. The last Ghost Dance by the Lakota people was held at Stronghold Table, now located inside the Badlands National Park on Pine Ridge. On Dec. 29, 1890, U.S. Calvary soldiers killed approximately 150 unarmed members of the Miniconjou band of Lakota at Wounded Knee , located on the Pine Ridge reservation.
