The Situational Leadership II (or SLII model) was developed by Kenneth Blanchard and builds on Blanchard and Hersey's original theory. According to the revised version of the theory, effective leaders must base their behavior on the developmental level of group members for specific tasks.

The S1 leadership style in the Hersey and Blanchard Situational Leadership Model puts a high emphasis on directive behaviour and a low emphasis on supportive behaviour. A leader's primary concern lays with the task delivery and less with the personal needs of the subordinates.

This is based on tasks, so an person can easily be a D1 on one task and a D4 level on another. This person then should be managed differently, depending o ntheir task competency.
