The decline in wolf trees in the eastern forest corresponds with the decline in large, old trees globally. It takes a long time to grow a tree with features wildlife can use. On a human timescale, they are, essentially, a finite resource. In the eastern forest, wolf trees survive in a matrix of young trees that rarely surpass 100 years.

Hardwood Trees Hardwoods are also known as angiosperms, broadleaf, or deciduous trees. They are abundant in the eastern forests of North America, though they can be found throughout the continent. Broadleaf trees, as the name suggests, bear leaves that vary in size, shape, and thickness.

How to Identify Types of Trees in North America

The only soft pine of eastern forests is the eastern white pine (Pinus strobus). All other species fall into the hard pine group. EASTERN WHITE PINE (Pinus strobus) needles are soft bluish-green, flexible, 3-5 inches long, in bundles of 5, with 3-5 fine white lines (of stomata) on two surfaces of each needle. Needles remain on the tree for two years.

Common Trees of the Pacific Northwest

The deciduous trees that make these forests famous include oaks, maples, beech, birches, and hickories. While evergreen conifers, such as spruce and firs, do live in the eastern forest, they are not as common or dominant as the deciduous trees except under particular types of local conditions.
